

MAP OF NASHUA PARKS

A- HOLMAN STADIUM

Home to the Nashua Pride baseball team, Holman Stadium is one of the oldest and brightest stars of the City's parks system, now shining with new skyboxes and seating, concession stands, restroom facilities and parking.

B- ARTILLERY FIELD

Construction of the home field for the Elm Street Junior High football team is complete, and the site will also be available for lacrosse during that sport's season.

C- LINCOLN PARK

The five baseball fields and the rectangular playing field will be renovated. Built in 1970, Lincoln Park is now the home of the Northwest Cal Ripkin Baseball League.

D- MINE FALLS PARK

Expertise of the US Army Corps of Engineers and funds from the US Environmental Protection Agency and the US Department of Housing and Urban Development will help restore the water quality of the Mill Pond and canal system by improving erosion control and reducing pollution. Recreational enhancements include upgrading the biking and walking trails and the recent renovation of the two Soifert soccer fields. An integral part of Nashua's Heritage Trail, the canal system is on the National Register of Historic Places and is a vital link in the City's cultural and environmental legacy.

E- STELOS STADIUM, home of Motta Field

This companion to the historic Holman Stadium, provides a rectangular playing field for Youth sporting events. The new stadium, located near exit 5-W on the Everett Turnpike, is the home field for the Nashua High School and Bishop Guertin football programs. Soccer, lacrosse & field hockey games are also played here.

RIVERSIDE STREET

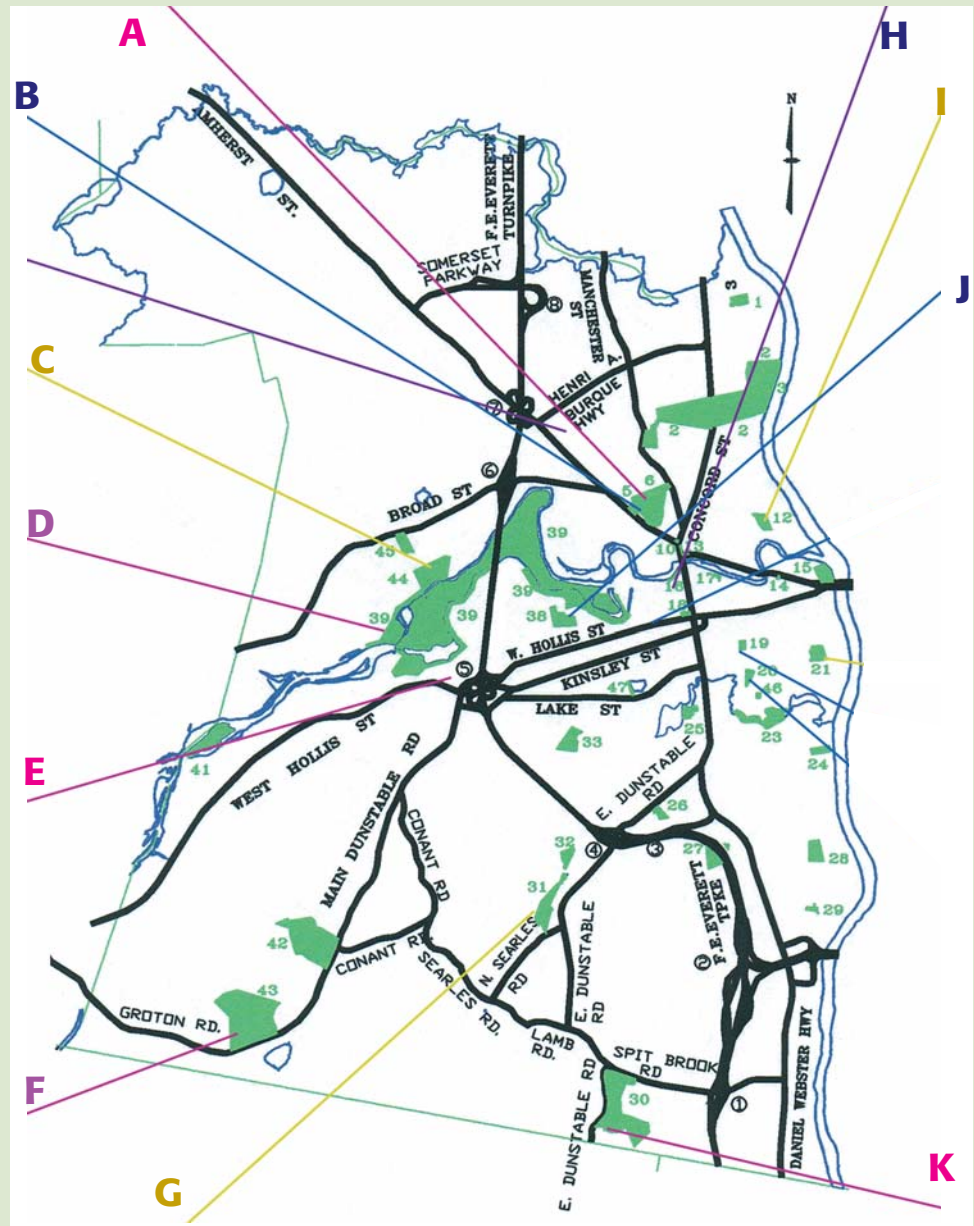
Construction of parking and access to the new stadium complex completed this major project.

F- SOUTHWEST PARK

The design process is underway for a comprehensive recreational complex at the former Yudicky Farm property. Plans include two playing fields, pedestrian and bike trails, basketball courts, a playground and possibly other expansion opportunities to provide a broad array of activities for residents.

G- KIRKPATRICK PARK / SHADY LANE

Renovation of the playing fields at this site will improve conditions for the leagues.



H- LE PARC DE NOTRE RENAISSANCE FRANCAISE

An important feature of Nashua's Heritage Trail, Riverfront Park on Water Street is renamed and dedicated to Nashua's French community, highlighted by the bronze sculpture "La Dame" by Ms. C. Gowell.

I- ATHERTON AVENUE PARK

The 1950's era park will be upgraded with renovations to the basketball court and softball field. New playground equipment and a refurbished picnic area will attract more families. The park hosts the Ray Oban League.

J- MEMORIAL PARK / Al Savage Basketball

Courts One new basketball court, combined with the recent resurfacing of the existing court, increase and enhance play opportunities. The redesign of the layout of the baseball field, home of the West Cal Ripkin / Babe Ruth League.

K- ROBY PARK

The Master Plan for Roby Park includes the reconstruction of two softball fields, a new parking area for the sledding hill, the installation of a handicapped-accessible playground, development of two miles of passive recreation trails, and the installation of a childrens' splash pad, snow-making equipment, and an outdoor refrigerated ice rink.
